Degree conferred in August of last year if all requirements are met.

If TWU financial aid is needed, 6 hours must be taken each semester. The student may elect to other options, which would delay graduation. Student should notify TWU advisor if TWU financial aid is necessary for completion and an alternate plan would be created.

Both institutions require that students be in good standing, including meeting academic and ethical standards at both institutions in order to remain in the program.
